This Just In...

New recreation supervisor thrives on team sports and coaching



Dave Lesmeister manages the athletic and contractual programs for Northville Parks and Recreation.

As the new recreation supervisor of programs at Northville Parks and Recreation, Dave Lesmeister is driven to make a difference in the lives of kids and families through sports.

"I love coaching," he said. "I start a season with a kid who may not have knowledge or skills of the sport and I see the maturation."

In his new role, he handles the athletic programs of basketball, volleyball, softball and lacrosse. He also oversees all contractual programs, such as tennis and dance. Sports camps and science camps also come under his purview. He works with service providers to ensure participants get the best program for their time, effort and money.

"I want to make sure that our programs are run the best they can be," Dave said. "I want participants to have a good time. Northville has high expectations and we aim to meet those standards."

Dave's first career choice was to be a NFL scout, but heavy competition tempered his plans. He earned a B.A. in Communications from Michigan State University in 2007. Landing a job in communications was stalled by the recession so Dave moved to Las Vegas in 2008 and earned a living by playing poker. He did well but the glitzy glamour of the City was at odds with his focus on fitness and family.

After only six months, he came back to Michigan and enrolled in Eastern Michigan University, where he earned a M.S. in Sports Management. At first it was hard for Dave to get a full-time job. He pieced together three part-time jobs: sports coordinator for youth at the Plymouth YMCA, building supervisor at the Livonia Recreation Center, and youth football coach for the Detroit Lions - where he conducted camps and clinics for kids ages 5-18.

His first full-time job was recreation coordinator for the City of Hamtramck. After 2-1/2 years, he became a recreation supervisor at Pittsfield Township and worked under the direction of Mark Gasche, who would later become director of Northville Parks and Recreation.

"My goal is to be a director," Dave said. "Mark is a great person to learn from. We work well together. As part of this new Parks and Rec team, we can take the program to the next level."

Dave lives in Canton with his wife Lauren and their 1-1/2-year-old son Oliver. He met Lauren at MSU (fellow Sparties) before she earned a degree as a physician's assistant from Wayne State University.





Jennifer Gould & Boisali Biswas
Northville Art House Exhibit

Be a pART of it! The Northville Art House is proud to present Confluence: Mixed Media Fiber Art by Jennifer Gould & Boisali Biswas. Confluence merges the talented world of two

Michigan artists who weave their own observations, themes and conceptions into extraordinary fiber art using both traditional and contemporary materials and techniques.

Jennifer Gould studies, experiments and is fascinated with textiles in all their varied forms. Influenced by nature, abstract and non-objective shapes, and wild colors, her pieces involve a wide diversity of techniques combined with unusual fabrics. Gould creates unique wall-hung and freestanding textiles as well as textile figures to express her place in the world.

Boisali Biswas comes from India, a country with a rich heritage of art and culture. She has a deep-rooted attachment to the traditional art forms of her native country and owes a part of her stylization to India's captivating traditional patterns and the rich array of colors. Biswas combines Western styles and techniques with ethnic arts from around the world to create a multicultural 'canvas' of fiber assemblages, art quilts, and wallpaper weavings.

Both artists have presented in galleries and received awards in exhibitions statewide and around the country.

Confluence opens with a reception on Friday, June 2, from 6 - 9 p.m. with a gallery talk at 7 p.m. The reception is sponsored by Holly Drouin of Luxury Home Sales and Rachel Wasserman of Caliber Home Loans. The exhibition runs through June 30 during Art House hours, Tuesday-Friday, 12 - 5 p.m. and Saturday, 12 - 4 p.m.

After lunch, in the adjacent theater, there will be a presentation by Lloyd Bruce Turnbull, Northville historian and raconteur. Bruce was born on Oct. 7, 1919, above his father's Northville Electric Shop, where his father did most of the original wiring and electrical for many homes between Northville and Howell. Bruce graduated from Northville High in 1937, married his high school sweetheart, and became a leader in the community. There are published books of his walking tours and stories of the early years. At age 97, he still lives in his home in downtown Northville.

Household paints, stains, dyes; floor wax, carpet cleaner; furniture polish, bathroom cleaners, stain removers, solvents; pharmaceutical waste (non-controlled substances only); nail polish, glue; fertilizer, lawn and garden chemicals, pesticides; antifreeze, motor oil, gasoline; automotive batteries and dry cell batteries, fluorescent bulbs (all types); fire extinguishers and smoke detectors; mercury thermometers, thermostats and elemental mercury.

Electronics Recycling - computer CPUs, monitors, printers, scanners, keyboards, mouse controls, cell phones, fax machines, copiers and televisions. (No CRT TV's or CRT monitors)

Commercial waste, industrial waste, radioactive material, explosives, ammunition, 55-gallon drums, shock sensitive materials, household trash, refrigerators, microwaves or other appliances, tires, yard waste and concrete. 

Scheduling online inspections

Contractors and homeowners in the City of Northville may <u>schedule inspections</u> <u>using the new online inspection portal</u>. The portal allows users to request all types of inspections, such as building, electrical, plumbing and heating. Users must have their assigned permit number when using the Inspection portal. If you are requesting an inspection for the following business day, it must be scheduled by 3:30 p.m.

Paperless billing option for utilities

Utility bill customers may now sign up to receive email bills or arrange for automatic payment through the City's website. E-bills are emailed on the billing date with a full page bill attached in PDF format. Automatic payment is an arrangement between the customer's bank and our bank by which the amount due is deducted from the customer's account each due date. Around Town

What to do if a water main breaks

Each year the City has between 10 and 20 water main breaks. If residents see water bubbling out of the ground, contact the Public Works Department at (248) 449-9930 or (248) 349-1234 after hours and report its location. The sooner the leak is identified and reported, the quicker it can be repaired, reducing the chances of contamination entering the water system, and minimizing the cost for lost water.

At Home

Free home fire safety review

The Northville City Fire Department, which serves the Cities of Northville and Plymouth, offers free home fire safety reviews. Call 248-449-9920 to schedule an appointment. A team of Fire Department personnel will meet with you at your home and review items such as smoke detectors, electrical outlets, storage of flammable materials, home escape plans and other items that can have an impact on home

fire safety. Home fire safety reviews can help reduce the risk of fire and its consequences.

Sewage backups

If you experience an overflow or backup of a sewage disposal system or storm water system and want to file a claim with the City, <u>please check our website for</u> details or call the Department of Public Works at 248-449-9930.

When presenting a written claim, you will be required to provide the following items:

- 1. Copies of receipts for cleaning costs, plumbing bills, or other bills.
- 2. List of the damaged items and receipts to prove the ages of your items. Reimbursement for the Actual Cash Value of damaged items is the maximum amount payable.
- 3. Please make an attempt to provide pictures of anything you wish to claim that was damaged due to the sewer backup.

The filing of a claim does not guarantee reimbursement.

Most homeowner's insurance will not cover sewage backups, but insurance can often be obtained as an added item. Ask your insurance provider about this option. Also, consider having a plumber install a check valve - backflow preventer - to help minimize the risk of backups and related damage.
