This Just In...

Use of fireworks on the 4th of July holiday



The Independence Day holiday is the busiest time of the year for the use of fireworks. The State of Michigan allows the sale and use of consumer-grade fireworks, such as roman candles, bottle rockets and other aerial explosives. For Independence Day, state law allows personal displays to be set off from 8 a.m. to midnight on July 3, 4 and 5. It prohibits municipalities from banning their use on federal holidays and one day before and after those holidays.

It is unlawful to ignite fireworks on public property, school grounds, church property, or the property of another person without that organization's or person's express permission. Violation carries a \$500 fine. Also, it is a misdemeanor for a person to use fireworks while under the influence of alcohol or drugs. The penalty is 30 days in prison, a fine of \$500, or both.

Fireworks law has drawn citizen objections

Many residents have complained about the state's restrictions governing the fireworks ordinance in the City of Northville. If you are interested in changing the laws regarding local control of fireworks, please contact your state representative or state senator. If you don't know who they are, <u>find out on this website</u>.

The current fireworks law, P.A. 256, went into effect on Jan. 1, 2012. An amendment in 2013 allows local municipalities to set their own restrictions on fireworks usage, except during the day and evening hours of federal holidays and the day before and after the holiday.

"Please be considerate of your neighbors if you plan to set off fireworks," said Northville Mayor Ken Roth, "Many residents are particularly sensitive to the noise from fireworks' explosions. The noise carries for blocks and can be disturbing to many veterans, children, the elderly and even pets."

If you are buying fireworks, make sure the seller has a certification from the Dept. of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs. See the <u>LARA website</u> for a list of sellers. Buyers must be 18 years or older.

Enjoy the fireworks in a safe setting

The Northville City Fire Department, which serves the Cities of Northville and Plymouth, urges residents who are using or viewing personal displays of fireworks to follow precautions for their own safety and to prevent fires.

"You really can't be too careful when it comes to handling fireworks" said Fire Chief Steve Ott. "According to the National Fire Protection Association, fireworks were responsible for an estimated 15,600 fires in the U.S. during 2013, and in 2014, U.S. hospital emergency rooms saw an estimated 10,500 people for fireworks-related injuries."

The Fire Department offers the following tips to help reduce the risk of fires and personal injury from fireworks:

- Be observant of any fireworks you use and know where they are going. Watch for the debris and any fires that may result.
- An adult should be present when fireworks are used. No child should be allowed to set off a firework.
- Sparklers burn very hot. Don't let a young child hold a sparkler.
- Ignite fireworks away from any houses, garages or other structures that could catch fire if the firework or its residual flame landed on it.
- Keep pets away from the area where fireworks are being launched.
- Don't light any fireworks inside any container, glass bottle or metal cylinders.
- Don't use fireworks near gasoline containers or around vehicles and equipment that contain gas.
- Don't light multiple fireworks at once.
- Don't hold a firework in your hand while lighting it.
- Don't look into a firework container to see why it didn't go off.
- Never try to re-light fireworks that don't go off the first time.
- Store fireworks in a cool, dry place away from any fuel containers or combustibles.
- Keep a bucket of water or a ready-to-use garden hose nearby. Douse fireworks if embers remain.

If you have questions or concerns about noise or unlawful use of fireworks, please contact the Northville Dispatch Center at 248-349-1234. If you see an injury or a fire caused by fireworks, please call 911. If using a cell phone, be prepared to report your location to the dispatcher.


Every Thursday through October Farmers' Market 8 a.m. - 3 p.m.

The Northville Art House is proud to present *Confluence:* Mixed Media Fiber Art by Jennifer Gould & Boisali Biswas. *Confluence* merges the talented world of two Michigan artists who weave their own observations, themes and conceptions into extraordinary fiber art using both traditional and contemporary materials and techniques.

Jennifer Gould studies, experiments and is fascinated with textiles in all their varied forms. Influenced by nature, abstract and non-objective shapes, and wild colors, her pieces involve a wide diversity of techniques combined with unusual fabrics. Gould creates unique wall-hung and freestanding textiles as well as textile figures to express her place in the world.

Boisali Biswas comes from India, a country with a rich heritage of art and culture. She has a deep-rooted attachment to the traditional art forms of her native country and owes a part of her stylization to India's captivating traditional patterns and the rich array of colors. Biswas combines Western styles and techniques with ethnic arts from around the world to create a multicultural 'canvas' of fiber assemblages, art quilts, and wallpaper weavings.

Both artists have presented in galleries and received awards in exhibitions statewide and around the country.

The exhibition runs through June 30 during Art House hours, Tuesday-Friday, 12 - 5 p.m. and Saturday, 12 - 4 p.m.



Scheduling online inspections

Contractors and homeowners in the City of Northville may schedule inspections using the new <u>online inspection portal</u>. The portal allows users to request all types of inspections, such as building, electrical, plumbing and heating. Users must have their assigned permit number when using the Inspection portal.

If you are requesting an inspection for the following business day, it must be scheduled by 3:30 p.m.

Paperless billing option for utilities

Utility bill customers may now sign up to receive email bills or arrange for automatic payment through the City's website. E-bills are emailed on the billing date with a full page bill attached in PDF format. Automatic payment is an arrangement between the customer's bank and our bank by which the amount due is deducted from the customer's account each due date. You can sign up online or call 248-449-9901 with questions.

Around Town

What to do if a water main breaks

Each year the City has between 10 and 20 water main breaks. If residents see water bubbling out of the ground, contact the Public Works Department at 248-449-9930 or 248-349-1234 after hours and report the location of the break. The sooner the leak is identified and reported, the quicker it can be repaired. Prompt repair is important because if reduces the risk of contaminants entering the water system and prevents further water loss.

At Home

Free home fire safety review

The Northville City Fire Department, which serves the Cities of Northville and Plymouth, is pleased to offer home fire safety reviews. Simply contact the Department at 248-449-9920 to schedule an appointment. A team of Fire Department personnel will meet with you at your home and review items such as smoke detectors, electrical outlets, storage of flammable materials, home escape plans and other items that can have an impact on home fire safety. This is a free service.

The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) reports that in 2014, structure fires caused 2,860 deaths, 13,425 injuries and \$9.8 billion in property damage. Home fire safety reviews can help reduce the risk of fire and its consequences.

Sewage backups

If you experience an overflow or backup of a sewage disposal system or storm water system and want to file a claim with the City, <u>please check our website for details</u> or call the Department of Public Works at 248-449-9930.

When presenting a written claim, you will be required to provide the following items:

- 1. Copies of receipts for cleaning costs, plumbing bills, or other bills.
- 2. List of the damaged items and receipts to prove the ages of your items. Reimbursement for the Actual Cash Value of damaged items is the maximum amount payable.
- 3. Please make an attempt to provide pictures of anything you wish to claim that was damaged due to the sewer backup.

The filing of a claim does not guarantee reimbursement.

Most homeowner's insurance will not cover sewage backups, but insurance can often be obtained as an added item. Ask your insurance provider about this option. Also, consider having a plumber install a check valve - backflow preventer - to help
