This Just In...

Mosquito pool in Pontiac tests positive for West Nile Virus

The first mosquito pool in Oakland County tested positive for West Nile virus (WNV). No human cases of the virus have been confirmed in Oakland County yet this year. Preventive measures help reduce the risk of catching this mosquito-borne disease, which is typically detected from June through September.

Follow these tips to prevent mosquito bites:

- Use insect repellent. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends the use of insect repellents containing active ingredients registered with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Always follow manufacturer's directions carefully.
- Be careful using repellent on the hands of children because repellents may irritate the eyes and mouth.
- Wear protective clothing such as long sleeved shirts and pants.
- Limit outdoor activity from dusk to dawn when mosquitoes are most active.
- Maintain window and door screens to keep mosquitoes out of buildings.
- Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by emptying standing water that collects in birdbaths, boats, buckets, tires, unused pools, roof gutters and other containers.

The Northville City Council is accepting applications to fill a vacancy on the Planning Commission, with members selected by the Northville City Council. The commission has nine members that serve three-year staggered terms. It regularly meets at 7 p.m. on the first and third Tuesday of each month.

The Planning Commission works on the development of the Master Plan and Master Plan Updates; reviews and approves site plan developments and special land use requests; and also reviews and makes recommendations to City Council on all rezoning requests as well as the Zoning Ordinance.

If you are interested in serving, are a registered voter in the City of Northville and have been a resident for at least two years, you can submit an application to the City Clerk. Applications are available on the City's website or at the City Clerk's Office, 215 W. Main Street, Northville, Michigan, 48167. Applications will be accepted until the vacancy is filled.


Free gun safety locks

Downtown Northville brings oversized games to Town Square for the summer



For those who enjoy playing Jenga, Corn Hole, Dominos or Connect 4 and like being outdoors during the summer, visit downtown Northville to "get your game on" with these newly made oversized games.

Sponsored by the Northville Downtown Development Authority (DDA) and The Village Workshop, the games are available in Town Square (on Main Street across from the clock). There is no cost or registration required to play the games, which are set up daily from 7 a.m. - 9 p.m.

"The oversized games were created to provide a fun family activity in Town Square and give residents and visitors another reason to visit Town Square," said Lori Ward, Northville DDA director. "It is also a creative way to show the capabilities of The Village Workshop and opportunities available for artisans and creatives at the makerspace."

Five volunteers, including one staff member from The Village Workshop, built the game boards and pieces. The 28 Domino tiles are 11.5" x 5.5"; the 54 Jenga bars measure 10" x 3.5"; the Connect 4 game is 50" x 50" and the Corn Hole game is 24" x 48."

Town Square serves as a central gathering space in Downtown Northville, hosting concerts on Friday nights and kids concerts on Tuesday mornings in the summer and other events throughout the year. The open-air patio is beautifully landscaped and equipped for concerts with a music system and stage. The area also has free WiFi. Overhead Tivoli lighting in the evenings creates a festive and welcoming ambiance.

Every Thursday through October Farmers' Market 8 a.m. - 3 p.m.





Tree permits required

A permit from the Building Department may be required prior to cutting down any tree in the City of Northville. Contact the Building Department at 248- 449-9902 to determine if a permit is required. Tree cutting is regulated by Section 90 of the <u>City of Northville Code</u>. The City diligently enforces this ordinance.

Parking

Did you know it is illegal to park on City Streets between 3 a.m. and 5 a.m. without a permit?

If you are having visitors or work done on your driveway and must park in the street overnight, call Community Dispatch at 248-349-1234 by 2 a.m. with the license plate number and street location of the vehicle to avoid a parking ticket.

At Home



At Home An easy way to dispose of old medications

Do you have outdated prescription or over-thecounter medications that you want to get rid of? There is a safe and convenient way to dispose of unwanted medications. Bring your unwanted medication - no liquids, needles or injectable medication - to the secure drop box

in the lobby at the Northville Township Police Department at 41600 Six Mile Road. There is no paperwork required and the bin can be accessed 24/7. When the drop box is full, collections are picked up for disposal by the Drug Enforcement Authority.

Sewage backups

If you experience an overflow or backup of a sewage disposal system or storm water system and want to file a claim with the City, <u>please check our website for details</u> or call the Department of Public Works at 248-449-9930.

When presenting a written claim, you will be required to provide the following items:

- 1. Copies of receipts for cleaning costs, plumbing bills, or other bills.
- 2. List of the damaged items and receipts to prove the ages of your items. Reimbursement for the Actual Cash Value of damaged items is the maximum amount payable.
- 3. Please make an attempt to provide pictures of anything you wish to claim that was damaged due to the sewer backup.

The filing of a claim does not guarantee reimbursement.

Most homeowner's insurance will not cover sewage backups, but insurance can often be obtained as an added item. Ask your insurance provider about this option. Also, consider having a plumber install a check valve - backflow preventer - to help minimize the risk of backups and related damage.
