This Just In...

City Council recap

May 7, 2018

Bond proposal initiative - City Council approved language for a street improvements bond proposal for \$3,250,000, funded by a 0.98 millage over 10 years. The Council hasn't officially decided to put it on the ballot in November, but will vote on it at the May 21 meeting. The Council invites residents to attend the next City Council meeting to learn more about the proposal by asking questions and/or stating their views.

Two new spring events - Council approved permits for two community events:

- Armed Forces Day Concert, Friday, May 18, 5 10 p.m., Ford Field, Free
 concert featuring the Killer Flamingos and a beer tent. Added security will be
 used to monitor alcohol purchases.
- Party in the 'Ville Saturday, June 2, 1 to 9 p.m., Street party on Main between Hutton and Center St., sponsored by North Center Brewery. With the theme, "All Things Northville," the event will feature three bands, and sell beer and wine from a street kiosk. Added security will be used to monitor alcohol purchase and restrict people from taking alcoholic beverages into stores.

Utility Master Plan - City Council approved a contract not to exceed \$12,000 with OHM Engineers and Advisors to develop a conceptual utility master plan of the water, wastewater and storm water systems within the area bound by Cady, Center, 7 Mile and Griswold in preparation for redevelopment. Currently the home of Northville Downs, the privately-owned property is under contact with Hunter-Pasteur Homes to redevelop the property for housing and mixed use, which is in accordance with the 2014 Master Plan.

Downtown light fixtures - Council approved the purchase of four street light poles and four high pressure sodium light fixtures from Herwig Lighting of Arkansas to replace three lights that were destroyed and purchase a replacement pole and light to have in inventory.

Of note:

Donna Tinberg was appointed by the City Council to serve as the Planning Commission member on the Board of Zoning Appeals for the remainder of her Planning Commission term expiring on June 30, 2020. She assumes the role of Jay Wendt, who retired from the posts in mid-April.

City Council approved a proclamation designating the month of May in the City of Northville as **Mental Health Awareness Month**. The request came from the Oakland Community Health Network.

Northville Historical Society 2018 Lecture Series "Early Organized Crime in Detroit" May 15, 2018

Though detectives denied it, the Italian mafia was operating in Detroit as early as 1900, and the city was forever changed. Bootleggers controlled the Detroit River and created a national distribution network for illegal booze during Prohibition. Gangsters, cops and even celebrities fell victim to the violence. Professor James Buccellato spent years researching and writing a book discussing the rise of organized crime in Detroit. Join us to hear this expert discuss this fascinating subject.

James Buccellato is a faculty member in the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice at Northern Arizona University. James taught in the Irvin D. Reid Honors College at Wayne State University in Detroit, MI for several years. He researches and writes about the politics of crime. His work appears in peer-reviewed journals, crime anthologies and

His book, Early Organized Crime in Detroit: Vice, Corruption and the Rise of the Mafia, was released on The History Press in late 2015. The book explores Detroit's struggle with gang violence, public corruption and the politics of vice during the tumultuous first half of the 20th century and includes rarely published images from the era.

The lecture will be at the New School Church at Mill Race Historical Village, 215 Griswold St, Northville at 7:00pm. The lecture is free of charge although donations are accepted at the door to help defray costs.

Armed Forces Day will be celebrated Saturday, May 19, and several events are planned throughout the Northville area. The celebration is largely organized by the Northville High School baseball program.



May 16-19

The Remembering Our Fallen exhibit will be displayed Wednesday through Saturday, May 16-19, at Northville High School, 45700 Six Mile Road, in its Michigan debut to remind Americans of the ultimate sacrifice made by those who died from wounds suffered in Iraq and Afghanistan while serving in the military.

The memorial includes 31 Tribute Towers with military and personal photos of almost 5,000 of

our nation's fallen since Sept. 11, 2001. This memorial was unveiled nationally Sept. 7, 2017, at the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C.

Organizers are still asking for help in contacting Gold Star families to include every single American who has died since 9/11 in The War on Terror. There is no fee to families; they are asked to go to www.RememberingOurFallen.org and provide basic information and two photos of their fallen loved one.





Historic Resource Council 2017 Directory is available

City Hall has a copy of the Historic Resource Council 2017 Directory, which lists architects, contractors, suppliers and others who specialize in historic preservation, rehabilitation and adaptation of historic structures and houses. Parking

Did you know it is illegal to park on City Streets between 3 a.m. and 5 a.m. without a permit?

If you are having visitors or work done on your driveway and must park in the street overnight, call Community Dispatch at 248-349-1234 by 2 a.m. with the license plate number and street location of the vehicle to avoid a parking ticket.

At Home

Tree permits required

A permit from the Building Department may be required prior to cutting down any tree in the City of Northville. Before cutting down any tree, you must first make application to the Building Department to determine if a permit is required. The City will be enforcing this ordinance if trees are cut down without the required permit. To avoid enforcement action, please contact the City of Northville Building Department at 248 449-9902. Tree cutting is regulated by Section 90 of the City of Northville Code.

An easy way to dispose of old medications

Do you have outdated prescription or over-the-counter medications that you want to get rid of? Don't flush these medications down the toilet - it pollutes the water supply; don't throw them away because they will end up in a landfill and may be consumed by wildlife. There is a safe and convenient way to dispose of unwanted medications. Bring your unwanted medication - no liquids, needles or injectable medication - to the secure drop box in the lobby at the Northville Township Police Department at 41600 Six Mile Road. There is no paperwork required and the bin can be accessed 24/7. When the drop box is full, collections are picked up for disposal by the Drug Enforcement Authority.

Sewage backups

Homeowners may experience an overflow or backup of a sewage disposal system or storm water system. If you intend to file a claim with the City, <u>please check our website for details</u> or call the Department of Public Works at 248-449-9930.

When presenting a written claim, you will be required to provide the following items:

- 1. Copies of receipts for cleaning costs, plumbing bills or other bills.
- 2. List of the damaged items and receipts to prove the ages of your items. Reimbursement for the actual cash value of damaged items is the maximum amount payable.
- 3. Please make an attempt to provide pictures of anything you wish to claim that was damaged due to the sewer backup.

The filing of a claim does not guarantee reimbursement.

Most homeowner's insurance will not cover sewage backups, but insurance can often be obtained as an added item. Ask your insurance provider about this option. Also, consider having a plumber install a check valve - backflow preventer - to help minimize the risk of backups and related damage.

Northville Police Department has free gun safety locks

Don't take the risk of having an unlocked gun get into the wrong hands - especially if you have young children and teenagers. Stop in at the Northville Police Department lobby to get your free gun safety lock. There are no forms to fill out and no waiting.
