# Public meeting scheduled for Sept. 4 for comments on proposed zoning changes

The Planning Commission is holding a public hearing on Sept. 4 at 7 p.m. at City Hall, 215 West Main Street, (lower level meeting room) to receive public input on proposed changes to the zoning ordinance that align with the vision of the City's master plan.

The City has prepared a draft overlay zoning ordinance amendment for a portion of Seven Mile and South Main Street, called the Seven Mile - South Main Street Overlay (SM-O). The proposed modification will allow general commercial uses and mixed use developments (commercial and residential) in this part of the City. New regulations for building height, setbacks, landscaping and parking are also proposed.

The City is also proposing to amend the zoning map by re-zoning two properties along S. Main Street, 580 and 598 S. Main St., from PR-1, Performance Regulated Industrial District No. 1 to GCD, General Commercial District. The rezoning is intended to guide any future redevelopment of these properties to a commercial use rather than an industrial use.

A draft of the proposed text amendment and map amendment are available at the Building Dept. during regular business hours (Monday- Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. with the office closed on Labor Day), and on the <u>City's website</u>. Written comments will also be accepted.

Northville Downs project not on this meeting agenda - Please note that the Planning Commission will not discuss the Planned Unit Development application for the Northville Downs project at this meeting, as had been announced earlier. Questions and Answers about the 2018 Street Bond



When Northville voters cast their ballot in the Nov. 6 election, they'll be asked to decide on a 0.98 millage for the issuance of a \$3,050,000 Street Improvement Bond to fund street repairs and upgrades for the next 10 years.

The City has developed a set of questions and answers (Q&As) concerning the millage. Here is one of the questions:

#### How will Northville determine which streets will be repaired?

Our engineers will objectively select the streets to be repaired, based on the condition at the time, using the Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating (PASER) system, and Roadsoft software. The overall condition of the roadway network (OCI) and practicalities - such as traffic volumes, scheduling close repairs together, and not obstructing alternative routes - will factor into the plan.

To see what your cost would be if the millage passes, find your taxable value for <u>Oakland properties</u>, for <u>Wayne County properties</u>. Multiply your taxable value by .00098 to determine your new annual rate during that 10-year period. That cost will be adjusted lower when new properties are added to the tax rolls.

#### Celebrating the '80s

Saturday, Sept. 22 Household Hazardous Waste Collection City Yards - 650 Doheny 8 a.m. - 2 p.m.

(Seven Mile West to Northville Road. Turn right on Northville Road to Doheny Dr.)

This event is open to residents of the Northville Township, City of Northville, and Livonia residents only.

This event is for the disposal of residential hazardous waste only. The wastes that will be accepted at this event are listed below:

- Aerosol cans, any household chemicals
- Antifreeze/Transmission Fluid Batteries: Automobile/Household/Marine
- Caustic/Acids
- Computer Equipment/Modem/Printers
- Compact Spiral/Fluorescent Light Bulbs
- Electronics; keyboards, mouse, cell phones
- Expired Medicine\*
- · Fax machines, VCR's and televisions
- Fuel oil/Gasoline/Gasoline and Oil Mixes

- Herbicides/Insecticides/Fungicides/Pesticides
- Kerosene
- Medical Waste (sharp items in containers only)
- Mercury items and mercury-contaminated debris
- Oil based Paints/Stains\*\*
- Primers/Turpentine/Varnishes
- Propane Tanks1# and 20#
- \* Expired Medicine can be taken to the Northville Township Police Department at any time.
- \*\* Latex (water-based) paint may be disposed of on your trash collection day if prepared correctly.

Proper disposal of paint requires the lids to be removed (put in trash receptacle) and allow the paint to dry out prior to disposal. (Placing clean kitty litter in the paint speeds up the drying process.) Put open cans of treated paint beside your trash, not in your trash. Read more...

#### Online payments for utility bills and taxes

If you want the convenience of paying taxes and utilities online, you can do so by visiting the City's website and using the services of Point & Pay, which processes the payment and charges a convenience fee. Go to: <a href="www.ci.northville.mi.us">www.ci.northville.mi.us</a> and select either Property Tax and Assessing Lookup or Utility Bill Statement and Payments from the Quick Links menu (left side, green column). Search for your property and click on the "Pay Online" button. You will be re-directed to the Point & Pay website to make a payment.

#### Streetlights

Streetlight out? Businesses and residents can <u>report streetlight outages online</u>. This link goes directly to the DTE streetlight outage reporting tool.

Businesses and residents who have a DTE wooden power pole on or adjacent to their property are eligible to have outdoor protective lighting installed on the pole to illuminate their private property. Residents may even qualify for no up-front cost installation. Please call 866-503-0627 and leave a detailed message that includes

name, address, city, zip code and phone number with area code for a DTE representative to contact you within 3 business days.

### **Historic Resource Council 2017 Directory is available**

City Hall has a copy of the Historic Resource Council 2017 Directory, which lists architects, contractors, suppliers and others who specialize in historic preservation, rehabilitation and adaptation of historic structures and houses. This directory will interest residents of historic homes, owners of businesses in historic buildings and others who own property or are involved in the City's Historic District. #### At Home

#### **Brush collection program**

The City of Northville allows residents to place branches at the curb without bundling or bagging them. Branches 6 feet long and up to 6 inches in diameter can be placed at the curb for removal by the City's solid waste collection contractor.

Residents can dispose of large piles of branches by placing them at the curb. Every Tuesday, year-round, a crew will come through each neighborhood and chip any branches left at the curb. Branches must be in the street right-of-way (between the street and the sidewalk). Simply stack the branches neatly behind the curb with the cut ends facing the street.

We cannot take roots, stumps dirt, lumber, railroad ties or any wood with metal in it. Residents can dispose of firewood pieces and stumps with their normal weekly garbage (Maximum 35 gallon cans and 60 lb. weight limit).

Residents may need to rake up small branches after the large brush piles are removed.

#### Sewage backups

If you experience an overflow or backup of a sewage disposal system or storm water system and want to file a claim with the City, <u>please check our website for details</u> or call the Department of Public Works at 248-449-9930.

When presenting a written claim, you will be required to provide the following items:

- 1. Copies of receipts for cleaning costs, plumbing bills, or other bills.
- List of the damaged items and receipts to prove the ages of your items.Reimbursement for the Actual Cash Value of damaged items is the maximum amount payable.
- 3. Please make an attempt to provide pictures of anything you wish to claim that was damaged due to the sewer backup.

The filing of a claim does not guarantee reimbursement.

Most homeowner's insurance will not cover sewage backups, but insurance can often be obtained as an added item. Ask your insurance provider about this option. Also, consider having a plumber install a check valve - backflow preventer - to help minimize the risk of backups and related damage.

#### Northville Police Department has free gun safety locks

Don't take the risk of having an unlocked gun get into the wrong hands - especially if you have young children and teenagers. Stop in at the Northville Police Department lobby to get your free gun safety lock. There are no forms to fill out and no waiting.
