Outdoor Watering Restrictions

Several years ago the City of Northville introduced **mandatory** outdoor watering restrictions, the purpose of implementing these new restrictions was to reduce our water use during peak hours of the day when the Great Lakes Water Authority (GLWA) had the most difficulty in meeting domestic water demands. For 2016, Northville will continue with these water restrictions.

Residents with underground irrigation systems (automatic sprinkling systems) may only water their grass between the hours of 12:00 Midnight and 5:00 a.m. in the morning on odd or even days based on the address of your house. If you address ends on an even number, set your irrigation system to only water during the hours listed above on even numbered days. If your address ends with an odd number, set your irrigation system to only water during the hours listed above on odd numbered days.

For residents who do not have an automatic sprinkling system, but water their lawns and gardens manually with a hose connected to the municipal water system, you may only water between the hours of 11:00 a.m. in the morning to 12:00 Midnight on odd or even days based on the address of your house.

Residents who do not follow these restrictions will be committing a Civil Infraction and issued a ticket. Tickets will cost you \$50 for the first offense and \$100 for repeat offenses.

If your home has a sprinkling system/hose connected to a private well, you may water at any time, but please contact the City's Department of Public Works at (248) 449-9930 to be put on a private watering list, so we won't bother you with sprinkling enforcement issues.

2016 Construction

The following is a list of street improvement projects proposed for 2016.

Rayson Street (Center Street to Horton Street)

This project will begin with necessary water main replacement work between Grace Street and Hutton Street. Actual road work will include replacing the asphalt pavement and concrete curb and gutter along with spot repairs to the concrete sidewalk.

Horton Street (Rayson Street to Lake Street)

This project will be done in conjunction with Rayson Street (above) and include new asphalt pavement, concrete curb and gutter along with spot repairs to sidewalk.

Elmsmere Street (West end to Whitegate)

This asphalt roadway will be removed and replaced with some drainage improvements.

Walnut Street (East Street to N. Center Street)

This project will begin with necessary water main replacement work from East Street to N. Center Street. Actual road work will include replacing the asphalt pavement and concrete curb and gutter along with spot repairs to the concrete sidewalk.

S. Wing Street (Cady Street to 7-Mile Road)

This project will begin with necessary water main replacement work from Cady Street to Fairbrook. Actual road work will include replacing the asphalt pavement and concrete curb and gutter where needed along with spot repairs to sidewalk. The replacement of water main and the reconstruction of this road will impact access to the US Post Office. Once construction begins in the roadway, residents are asked to try and minimize their trips to the Post Office or go to a Post Offices in Novi, Livonia or Canton.

Before these construction projects begin, City Hall will send a letter to property owners living along these roadways. The letter will give you an update on the project, its expected start and completion dates, along with details about parking, emergency access, trash collection and such. Look for this letter and keep it for the duration of the construction project.

In addition to the above projects the Department of Public Works will undertake its annual sidewalk repair program along with a crack sealing program on some of Northville's newer roadways. The Department of Public Works realizes that construction projects like these can temporarily impact residents driving through our neighborhoods. We apologize for this inconvenience and thank you for your cooperation.

Baby Wipes – A Serious Problem for Sewer Systems

Baby wipes have been on the market for a long time, but it was not until a few years ago that manufactures started stamping "FLUSHABLE" on them. In addition to baby wipes this nonwoven material is now used for all kinds of cleaning purposes, and people more often than not are flushing them down toilets. Clearly, nonwoven wipes will flush down your toilet, but it is important the residents know that they will also lead to sewer obstructions and backups. The Department of Public Works, urges you to stop flushing baby wipes and other nonwoven wipes down your toilets. These wipes are not decomposing in our sewer system and will lead to serious sewer backups. Please, put only toilet paper down your toilet.

August 2, 2016 Primary Election – Polls open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m.

Precinct 1 (Wayne County voters): Northville Community Center, 303 W. Main St.

Precinct 2 (Oakland County voters): Amerman School, 847 N. Center St.

Last Day to Register to Vote is July 5, 2016: Persons registering to vote in person must show an acceptable photo id or sign an affidavit. If you choose to register to vote by mail, you may be required to vote in person your first election. If you are a college student and you will be going away to college, consider registering to vote in person.

Am I Registered to Vote? Where do I vote? What is on the ballot? How do I get an Absent Voter Ballot?

Visit our website at www.ci.northville.mi.us. Click on the Election Information button on the left side of the Home Page. On the Elections Page you may verify your voter registration, find your polling location, print an Absent Voter Ballot Application, and view/print a sample ballot.

Absent Voter Ballot Information: Absent Voter ballot mailings will begin around July 5th. Turn in your AV ballot application early to take advantage of receiving your AV ballot quickly! The office will begin issuing AV ballots over the counter beginning the week of July 18th. Photo ID requirement is in effect for in-person Absent Ballot Voters.

ELECTION INSPECTORS

The City of Northville is always accepting applications for Election Inspectors. The City of Northville has two precincts and two absentee ballot voter counting boards that must be staffed on Election Day. Consider serving your community on Election Day!

Voters Did You Know? The City Clerk's Office maintains a Permanent Absent Voter List. Benefits of being on this list include: You will automatically receive an absentee ballot application for every election. If you qualify for an absent voter ballot (i.e. at least 60 years or older, expect to be out of town on election day), complete and return the application. An absent voter ballot will be mailed to you. You can take your time studying the ballot and vote from home when you are ready.

Recent legislation eliminated the option to vote a "straight party" ballot for all General Elections, including the November 8th Presidential Election. General Election ballots are very long, with many contests and candidates. Elimination of the "straight party" voting option may potentially increase voting times and lines at polling places may be longer. Consider the ease and convenience of voting by absentee ballot.
